



Faith-Filled Generosity 2022 Stewardship Campaign

“Giving money away is a statement of faith. It is a declaration that God has provided all that we have and that what we have is enough...[The] goal is for every Christian to grow in their generosity all the time. Everyone can grow in generosity. Sometimes, due to life circumstances, that could mean giving away less money...At other times it could mean giving differently...Or it could mean including the church in your estate plan...People who have discovered generosity have come to understand God as a God of abundance.” (Abundance by Rev.
