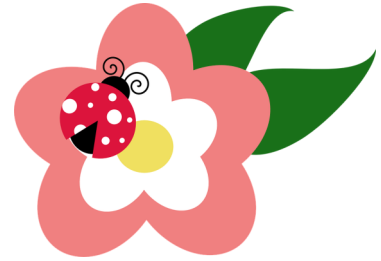

ST. PETER

March 6 is Ash Wednesday. For Christians, this is a day of repentance and reflection, as we consider the ways that we have sinned and failed to be full disciples of Jesus. Many of us will go to worship and get a cross of ashes drawn on our foreheads which we wear for the remainder of the day. This cross is to recall us to our baptism (when a similar cross was drawn on our foreheads with water) and also of our mortality—that's the ash part. It is a reminder that all things are dust and ashes—even us—and that only God is forever.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of the season of Lent. "Lent" is an Old English word for "spring." Lent is the 40 days (6-1/2 weeks actually) before Easter, the day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. During Lent, many of us take on a discipline, the purpose of which is to help us focus more on the presence of God in our lives. Traditional Lenten disciplines are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (or acts of charity). At St. Peter, we are encouraging people to focus on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew, chapters 5-7).

Please feel free to take one of the devotional books on the Sermon on the Mount and/or one of the fliers entitled "A Guide to the Discipline of Lent" and use them for your own Lent journey. And if you do not have a home church, you are welcome to worship with us at St. Peter on Ash Wednesday at 7 am, 12 noon, or 7 pm. The 7 am service is very brief—about 20 minutes.

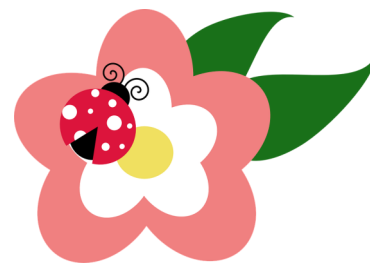
May God bless you with a meaningful Lent journey.
